

Alcoholic drinks disallowed. 16. No person shall introduce into the Baths any spirituous or intoxicating liquors or drink any intoxicating liquor therein (except in the case of sickness or accident), or enter or remain in the Baths while in a state of intoxication.

Offensive language disallowed. 17. No person using the Baths shall at any time while on the premises use any indecent or offensive language, or behave in an indecent manner or interfere with any officer or servant employed by the Council in the proper execution of his duty.

Disorderly conduct. 18. Any person guilty of disorderly or improper conduct of any description may be ordered out of the Baths and shall forthwith leave the Baths when so ordered. In any such case no refund of entrance fee will be made, and such person may be refused admittance subsequently.

Dogs disallowed. 19. Dogs and other animals are not allowed inside the premises of the Baths.

Non-liability of Council. 20. The Council shall not be responsible for any loss or damage suffered by any person using the Baths notwithstanding such loss or damage may have been caused by the negligence or criminal act of any servant or agent of the Council.

Closing of Baths. 21. The Council may close the Baths at any time without notice.

Penalty. 22.—(1) Any person who contravenes the provisions of by-law 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 15, or 19 shall be guilty of an offence: Penalty, a fine of twenty-five dollars.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of by-law 11, 13, 14, 16, 17, or 18 shall be guilty of an offence: Penalty, a fine of fifty dollars.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE, 1962
THE PUBLIC HEALTH (KUCHING MUNICIPAL COUNCIL)
(REFUSE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL) BY-LAWS, 1966
(Made under section 115)

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 115 of the Public Health Ordinance, 1962, the Kuching Municipal Council has, with the approval of the Governor in Council, made the following By-laws:—
Ordinance No. 24/1962

- Citation and commencement. Interpretation.
1. These By-laws may be cited as the **Public Health (Kuching Municipal Council) (Refuse Collection and Disposal) By-laws, 1966.**
 2. In these By-laws—

"Council" means the Kuching Municipal Council;

"refuse" includes garbage, tins, bottles, ashes, sweepings from dwellings, offices, shops and all other forms of non-liquid domestic refuse, but does not include building debris, refuse from gardens or stables nor waste products from factories, workshops or godowns;

"refuse bin" includes any bin or receptacle provided by the Council in a public place for the purpose of having refuse deposited therein.

3. The occupier of every premises in an area in which a house- Occupier
hold refuse removal service is provided by the Council shall, within to provide
fourteen days of the service upon him of a notice in writing by the refuse bins.
Council, provide himself with one (or more if required) metal refuse
bins of a pattern and construction specified in by-law 4.

4. Every bin provided in pursuance of by-law 3 shall— Type of
bin
(a) be of not lesser than $2\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet capacity but of not permitted.
greater capacity than $3\frac{1}{4}$ cubic feet;
(b) be of non-corrugated metal and of a metal gauge of not
less than 22;
(c) be substantially cylindrical in shape;
(d) be fitted with an efficient and tight-fitting cover; and
(e) be fitted with two handles so placed as to facilitate ready
handling:

Provided that the Council may permit the use of bins of such
other design or specification as it may approve in respect of any
particular premises or class of premises.

5.—(1) Every occupier shall cause all refuse bins and covers Bins to be

6. All refuse bins shall be kept covered and placed on the edge Position

the hours of 6 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily.

7. The Council may provide facilities, including the provision of Disposal

8. Any person engaged in any trade, manufacture or business Removal
shall, if so required by the Council, remove at his own cost any trade and disposal
refuse or other waste material to such a place or site as the Council of trade
may direct. refuse.

9.—(1) The Council may, at the request of any person, remove Removal of
trade refuse, building debris, or other waste material on charge. trade refuse
or other

materials.

(2) The Council may cause to be removed any trade refuse or
other waste material for any person who has failed to remove it
forthwith after being required in writing to do so by the Council and
the person for whom the work is done shall be liable for the cost of
such removal.

- Use of Council tipping ground.
- 10.—(1) Any person with the permission of the Council may use at a charge any site provided by the Council for the deposit of refuse or other waste material in bulk.
- (2) No person shall use any site of the Council for the burial of carcases of animals unless with the permission and under supervision of the Council.
- Offences.
11. No person shall deposit or throw, or cause or permit to be deposited or thrown—
- (a) in a refuse bin—
- (i) any dangerous chemical substance or dangerous drugs;
 - (ii) any unextinguished ashes or any other material which is likely to cause fire or explosion;
 - (iii) any dung, faeces, carcases, liquid wastes or any other offensive matter; or
- (b) in a public place, any carcase, refuse or waste matter other than in a place provided for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws.
- Penalty.
12. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these By-laws, shall be guilty of an offence: Penalty, a fine of two hundred dollars and, in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine of ten dollars for every day during which such offence continues.
